## Mark's Musings

Palm Sunday falls this year on April 1. April Fool's Day. Without meaning any irreverence, that's not a bad connection. In 1 Corinthians 1, Paul writes, "we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles." What Jesus does in Holy Week looks foolish to the world, particularly what he does regarding power. He starts by riding into town on a lowly donkey, the man of peace, not the conquering warrior. Doesn't he understand that we need the Romans thrown out on their ears? And doesn't he have the power to do it? Then by the end of the week, he winds up nailed to a cross, his crucifixion egged on by the religious leaders and carried out by the political and military rulers. Why does he allow such a thing? Doesn't he have the power to stop it? The taunt at the cross rings in our ears: "He saved others, let him save himself." Well, why doesn't he? What a foolish use of power—or perhaps what a foolish refusal to use power. But Jesus has other ideas about what matters, other understandings of what power—real power—can accomplish. And what begins mysteriously on Palm Sunday ends triumphantly on Easter Sunday with the whole world turned upside down. Let us follow, watch, listen, and learn. And let us be ready to have our lives changed forever.
