The Banjara are a Roma people, primarily located in India, with a vibrant culture of colors, dancing, and music. Their history is one of marginalization by society, hindered education, and poverty. Eddie and Macarena Aldape work alongside the Banjara through medical camps and The Banjara Gypsy Children's Home, a safe place for boys whose families cannot support them. The Aldapes dream of opening a similar home for girls. "Once a person has a personal encounter with Christ, they find value in Him who was willing to give His life for them. This gives a whole new meaning to, 'All things are made new,'" the Aldapes say. Passport's camp offering this summer will support the Aldapes' ministry offering new life and hope to Banjara families offering safe shelter, education and the unconditional love of Christ.

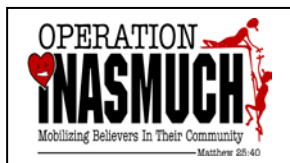

Following is a brief summary of the March mission projects:

- Our March donations to the WS and HP Hospice Homes were delivered on March 9 and 10 and again on March 28 to the HP location. Please know that we receive thank you letters regularly for our donations—they so very much appreciate our commitment. Jean also reported the HP Hospice organization is especially needing crafters and she will be working with them on a special craft—please see Jean Foster if you are willing to help. Mark your calendar, our next “Cookies for Hospice” day will be Sunday **April 6**.
- We were pleased that the Baptist Men met with the WOM at our March meeting as future projects were discussed and handouts were given regarding these upcoming ventures.
- Three WOM ladies took homemade bread and cookies to the PICU and PIMC (step-down unit) at Baptist Hospital on March 21 as part of the professional/spiritual relationship we are establishing with the nurses and patient families. Snacks of all kinds, Dr. Pepper, coffee & creamer were also delivered each with an uplifting note attached. We also took hygiene kits, comfy slipper socks, regular socks and ladies underwear for the trauma patient mothers as had been known to us was a very real need. This, partnership will be an ongoing mission project – see Jane for details of how you, too, can get involved. Prayers were especially requested by all the nurses.
- Another special emphasis during March was Crisis Control – all attending were encouraged to participate since their donations would be matched by the Feinstein Foundation, and WOM donated many hygiene items from their stock room.
- A listing of all the Baptist Children’s Home Annual April Food Roundup items was reviewed, and it was decided that we would concentrate on collecting paper products, laundry detergent, mac & cheese, Jiffy corn muffin mixes, and peanut butter.
- Just a reminder on **May 3 we will be observing Operation Inasmuch**. Each person, SS class, group, etc. is encouraged to develop a special mission project to be carried out on that day. Prayerfully consider what you can and are willing to do!

The WOM will meet on Wednesday night **April 2** immediately following our Family Night supper—everyone is more than welcome to join us.
