Then, I'm excited to welcome you all to a five-week Intergenerational Study that Mark and I will lead on Sunday nights beginning on the 17th. The study is just what it sounds like: a time for all our church family, of all ages, to study God's stories together. I hope you'll find this time to be refreshing and renewing as your family's Sunday night routine changes a bit in Lent.



WOM Mission Project

In January, the Women on Mission delivered homemade cookies to the family of Melvin Ellis in the Cancer Center in High Point and also to the Hospice Home in High Point.

At our January monthly meeting, we all signed a get well card for Vernell, a dedicated WOM member recovering from heart surgery.

We spent considerable time brainstorming ways to reach out to our community and following are the projects we discussed and hope to embark on in the near future:

1. Continue with the Hospice cookies and periodically collect breakfast items, puddings, Kleenex, etc. for the Hospice facilities; also to provide a meal for families at the Hospice Home
2. Make neck and small soft round pillows for patients in Hospice
3. Make heart shaped pillows for patients in local cardiac units to be used immediately following heart surgery.
4. Sew more "cuddlies" for Newborns in Need
5. Begin a homemade quilt to be presented to someone undergoing long term or terminal illness
6. Prepare Easter baskets for the children at the Women's Shelter along with gift bags for the women – this project will be a joint effort with the Baptist Men

Jean also learned of a need for adult size bibs and "fidget" aprons for Hospice and a couple of the members have already begun making these items.

To enable our members to work at home during the winter months, the sewing projects will become "tag – relay" team efforts. Some members will cut out the fabric, pass it on to others who will sew and then on to others who will be asked to stuff the pillows.
