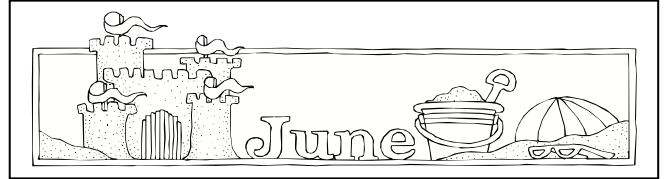

That I may run, rise, rest with thee.

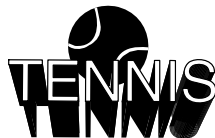
As summer begins, that last line is as good a prayer as any. In the days before us, may you run, rise, rest with God. Amen.
